# RI Helps With Transition to New Rotary Year

Information, foundation giving, e-learning, club and committee goal setting are just a few clicks away with Member Access through the Rotary International website <a href="https://www.rotary.org">www.rotary.org</a>.

Member Access is a great way for each Rotary member to track his or her individual giving, monitor club goals, and get club information. Don't have your Member Access? Easy to set up with email address and your member number. Member number is on your mailing label of The Rotarian magazine.

Club officers can use Member Access to submit changes in membership, report club officers, and set goals that can be tracked through the year. Be sure to update through the Club secretary or Club president. It is always a good idea to print Club based reports at the beginning of the Rotary year.

Membership committee members can find club membership trends for the past 3-5 years at their fingertips rather than the long worksheet that took hours in years past.

Foundation committee members will want to print out a "new year" report of club member giving status. The report can be very helpful in setting club giving goals that can be entered and tracked through Member Access. Much easier than legal pads and computer worksheets of the past.

And finally, any member can sign up for digital newsletters from Rotary International. Club presidents may want the Rotary Leader, New Generations Committee members may sign up for their area. Other newsletters include the Weekly Update, Public Relations, and Service Projects. I learn a lot every time I read them. These newsletters sometimes have great You Tube clips too.

Take a few minutes to set up your Member Access and subscribe to some newsletters. Then Engage Rotary and Change Lives. Happy New Rotary Year!!

# Exchange Students Attend SCRYE Camp

Rotary District 5630's five long-term exchange students for 2013-14 attended the South Central Rotary Youth Exchange (SCRYE) outbound camp in Siloam Springs, Ark., June 19-23. Fifty-eight exchange students from 14 districts in eight states participated in the camp along with 12 Rotexes (former exchange students) and 16 Rotarians. The camp helps prepare the students for their yearlong exchange living in another country and in another cul-

Three Rotexes from District 5630 served as camp counselors. They were: Dakota Bergen of Paxton, Matt Kramer of Hastings and Blake Yarrington of Merna. Paula Witt of the Hastings Sunrise club and Ronna Morse of Valentine accompanied the students.

Paula concluded a three-year term as co-chair of the camp, during which she was instrumental in revising the camp curriculum. The 5630 students will depart for their host countries from late July through mid-August.

### Short Term Exchanges Underway

Four students from District 5630 are participating in the Short Term Youth Exchange Program. Three are overseas now. Hannah Gilbertson of Grand Island is in Switzerland; Taylor Carlberg of Johnson Lake is in Germany and Mary Leonard of Julesburg, CO, is in Belgium.

Emma Petersen of North Platte is hosting her exchange partner, Vittoria Di Guinta, from Italy.

Each girl will live from four to six weeks with their exchange partner's family and then hosts her partner.

### Expect Grant Funds to 28 Clubs in August

Back in early March, District leadership conducted several training sessions which was part of the requirement for individual clubs to apply for available grant money. The District 5630 Grants subcommittee has been busy the past month reviewing the applications that clubs have prepared for the 2013-14 Rotary year. I am pleased to announce that a total of 28 clubs participated and were approved. Each club was awarded \$625 coming from the District's designated funds (DDF).

As a refresher, these funds come from gifts that were made to Rotary International by District members and individual non-Rotarians, The funds are not designated for one of RI's programs so they become annual giving.

Rotary International keeps these funds for three years. After that time, 50% of that money goes to the World Fund and the remainder comes back to the district as DDF. Those funds can be spent on several Rotary Foundation programs, including district grants.

Our committee will soon be sending letters to each of the 28 clubs with instructions on how to handle the grant money. A request has been sent to RI requesting those funds and each club should expect to receive a check for the grant amount by early August. Most clubs are also contributing club money in addition to the District grant.

### Clubs Shine in PolioPlus Year End Results

District 5630 finished the year with a record \$83,701.16 raised for Polio Plus. Forty-four percent of this total was raised by one club, Kearney Rotary Club. This was largely through generous philanthropy of a local family that had a personal family experience with polio. The Kearney Rotarians were instrumental in making this donation possible by spreading the word about Rotary's primary international mission to eradicate polio.

Other clubs deserving special recognition are Grant and North Platte Sunrise clubs. Both of these clubs raised funds averaging more than \$100 per member for the year.

Other clubs which deserve special thanks by contributing above the suggested \$50/member minimum were: Arnold, Chappell, Gothenburg, Grand Island, Kearney Dawn, McCook, North Platte (Noon) and Ogallala.

Thank you to all clubs that participated in Polio Plus fundraising last year. For those clubs that did not contribute to Polio Plus, we remind you that this is the TOP PRIORITY of Rotary International and ask you to PLEASE consider a contribution this year.

### Why July 1?

Ever wonder why the Rotary year begins 1 July? The international convention initially played a key role in determining the start date of our fiscal and administrative year.

Rotary's first fiscal year began the day after the first convention ended, on 18 August 1910. The 1911-12 fiscal year also related to the convention, beginning with the first day of the 1911 convention on 21 August.

At its August 1912 meeting, the Board of Directors ordered an audit of the finances. The auditors recommended that the organization end its fiscal year on 30 June to give the secretary and treasurer time to prepare a financial statement and determine the number of club delegates to the convention.

The executive committee concurred, and at its April 1913 meeting, designated 30 June as the end of the fiscal year. This also allowed for changes to the schedule for reporting club membership and payments. Even The Rotarian changed its volume numbering system to correspond to the fiscal year.

Rotary continued to hold its annual conventions in July or August until 1917. At the 1916 event in Cincinnati, OH delegates approved holding future conventions in June, mainly because of the heat in cities where most of them occurred. The next convention was held in Atlanta, GA.
