



District Governor's Message



Saying Goodbye to a beloved Past District Governor Neal Baxter __1923-2014


I have been asked to write a short note for our Rotary District newsletter concerning my father, Neal Baxter, and his recent passing. Many of you have known my dad and of his passion for Rotary which he has shared with me and others over the years. For those who haven't heard, we checked dad into the hospital because of pain in his hip and lower back. It turned out that this was due to multiple fractures in that area, as the bone had been weakened by cancer that was also then located in the liver and likely the brain. We suspect this may have originated from a malignant melanoma that had been surgically removed a little over a year earlier. They knew it was close to metastasizing, but felt they had it contained. It seems highly likely that this was the origin of the cancer that had spread throughout his body. The blessing was that dad did not suffer a lot and he passed from this life peacefully, on March 30th, just 5 days after this diagnosis was delivered.

Dad truly loved Rotary and all of the fine people he had met through this amazing organization. He was a Past-President and Secretary of our North Platte Noon Rotary Club and went on to be District Governor in 1985-86. He served as Team Leader of a GSE to Birmingham, England in 1988 and also represented the RI President at District Conferences in California and Wisconsin. He was chosen as a delegate to the Triennium Council on Legislation in Caracas, Venezuela in 1995. Perhaps his most memorable Rotary experience was when he and Jim Conley drove a Rotary-donated fire truck to El Paso, TX to be delivered to Rotarians from a community in Mexico who was badly in need of this fire truck. The video of this trip is priceless! Dad was also a multiple Paul Harris Fellow and believed strongly in the Polio-Plus program, partly due to the fact that he lost his only brother to polio when he was in his early teens.

Many of you have asked about my mother and I am pleased to report she is doing well, as she is a woman of amazing spiritual strength. We miss dad, but we find much to celebrate about his life and what he was able to contribute toward a better world, especially through Rotary.




The 40 winners of the trip will experience one of the best experiences that they will have going to a Husker Game!!


Polio Update

POLIO SPREADING IN PAKISTAN – ELSEWHERE RE-TREATING

For the last three years, children in the tribal areas of northwest Pakistan have been trapped in an area where polio is spreading and vaccination is not generally available. The Taliban have opposed vaccination until the USA halts drone attacks in this region which is also a haven for Islamic militancy and extremism. The vicious opposition to polio vaccination has resulted in multiple assassinations of polio vaccinators and police trying to provide them some protection. The consequence of this is a steadily rising number of polio cases in Pakistan with only 58 infections in 2012 followed by 93 cases in 2013 and as of mid-July in 2014 already 99 cases. This is compared to just 21 at the same time in the previous year...more than four times the cases for the same part of the year!

Rotary's new strategy has been to provide cell phones to midwives to help gather information on unvaccinated kids and target the "missing children" who have not yet been reached. The midwives are already involved in tracking pregnancies and providing other vaccinations, so this a simple way to target polio vaccinations more precisely.

Another Rotary effort involved working to Coca-Cola to build a water treatment plant in Karachi near a school to give polio-age kids clean water. NEW PAKISTAN VACCINATION CAMPAIGN

Rotary is not alone in the campaign to provide polio vaccinations to Pakistan. A large-scale campaign under the slogan “Health for All – Better Future” is being sponsored by Shaikh Mohammad, Crown Prince of Abu Dhabi and the United Arab Emirates armed forces. The humanitarian initiative in the month of June reported reaching 3.04 million Pakistan’s tribal areas, which is well ahead of the goal of 3.64 million by end of September.

ROTARY’S POLIO PLUS LEADERS FEATURED IN FORBES MAGAZINE

In a July 21, 2014 opinion contributed by Devin Thorpe, Forbes Magazine features a look at the tremendous progress toward Polio eradication inspired by the leadership of Rotary International. While citing the reduction

of polio cases from 400,000 per year three decades ago to around 400 annually, the article also notes the challenges of providing vaccinations in areas of violence and conflict and highlights



the role of Rotary in the eradication effort. POLIO CASES THIS YEAR

As of July 31, 2014, Pakistan has reported 102 cases of polio with two more new cases already in the first two days of August (compared to 22 cases by this time a year ago). Similarly, the neighboring areas of Afghanistan have seen an increase counting 8 cases (compared with only 3 by the same time, last year). With polio flaring up in these tribal regions, the efforts to vaccinate are urgent.

Meanwhile signs of progress are being noted in Africa with only 5 cases of wild polio virus in Nigeria (compared to 40 in the same period last year). The total number of patients affected elsewhere included only 16 cases (compared to 105 by the same time last year). These breakout cases are spread across Somalia, Equatorial Guinea, Cameroon, Ethiopia, Syria and Iraq with none seen in Kenya, so far this year.
