Rotary Youth Exchange: Inspiring Students and Supporting Polio Eradication

As of September, we are well into another exciting Youth Exchange (RYE) cycle! Preliminary applications for Nebraska students opened on September 1st, with a deadline of October 15th. Six outstanding candidates, representing McCook, Sidney, North Platte, Elwood, Grand Island, and Broken Bow, were promoted by their local sponsoring clubs and interviewed for the 2026–2027 study abroad year. Rotarians from across the district participated in the interviews on November 1st in North Platte, with special thanks to North Platte Rotarians Stu Shepherd and John Hales for providing meals to the 30+ participants. Students will be notified of committee decisions by the end of November.

Before the interviews, hosted students from across Nebraska (Districts 5630/5650) joined the Ogallala Rotary "Haunt" on October 17–18, transforming into creative characters to support Polio fundraising. Ogallala Rotary generously provided lodging, meals, tours, and even \$250 cash for students to enjoy during their visit. Thank you to everyone who contributed to this heartwarming effort!

The following weekend, Hastings Rotary hosted students who organized a Color FunRun with the goal of raising \$500 for the Rotary Polio Foundation. Inspired by William Campos from Brazil, and with guidance from Hastings Rotarians and the Hastings High School Cross Country coach, the students pulled off an incredible event in less than three weeks. Over 30 participants joined the run/walk, and the Hastings Tribune featured them on the front page, calling them an "outstanding, well-spoken, and socially conscious group of young people." The event raised over \$880 in registration fees and donations, and with a \$500 match from Hastings Sunrise Rotary and additional support from Hastings Noon Rotary, the net total reached nearly \$1,400—well surpassing their goal!

With this year's USA tour for inbound students canceled, we are exploring alternative travel opportunities within the US through mid-July. If you are planning vacations or travel, consider inviting one or two RYE students along—you will be truly blessed by the experience. These young people are remarkable ambassadors for Rotary and our communities!

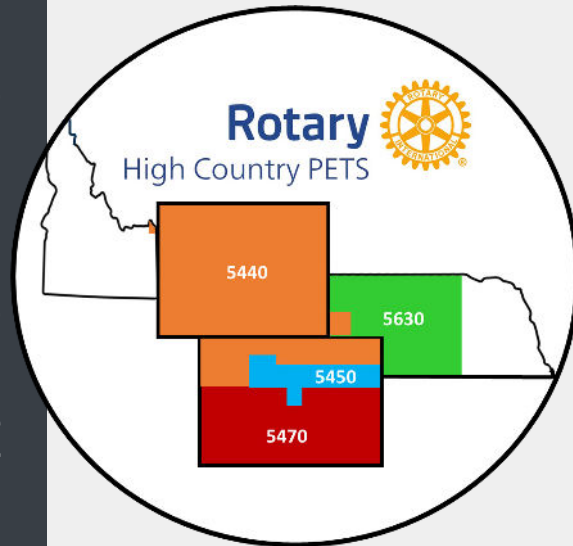
